

**EMERGENCY MOTIONS – 14<sup>th</sup> May 2018**

<b>No. 1 Cllrs Frank Kennedy Mannix Flynn John Lyons Christy Burke Mary Freehill Janice Boylan Daithí Doolan</b>	In advance of the coming into force of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) (Regulation (EU) 2016/679) on 25 May 2018, this Council resolves that the Chief Executive shall ensure that comprehensive and relevant training and guidance is provided to Members on the obligations and duties on individual Members, in particular in respect of interaction with constituents, arising from the GDPR and that, in the event that such training and guidance is to be provided by way of training session, the session be recorded and made available to members in light of the inevitability that the time at which such training is to take place will not be a time at which all Members are available to attend.	On 25 May 2018 the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) takes effect. The Council meeting on 14 May 2018 is the last full Council meeting which takes place before 25 May 2018. There are serious implications arising from the GDPR for those who control or process personal data of individuals. In the discharge of their functions as members of the Council all 63 members control and/or process personal data of individuals. Therefore, any function of the local authority which involves (a) one of the 63 members and (b) personal data of individuals falls within the ambit of my emergency motion. This encompasses an enormous volume of the Council's functions. Unfortunately, despite repeated requests, the level of relevant guidance which has been provided to members of Dublin City Council as to the duties and obligations of the members by the Council has, to date, been close to non-existent. As this is the last full Council meeting before 25 May 2018 the lack of adequate guidance provided to the members to date gives rise to an urgent and/or potentially dangerous emergency situation requiring immediate action of Council which cannot be addressed by an ordinary motion to the City Council or to an Area Committee. Accordingly, the test for an emergency motion as provided for in Standing Order 34 is manifestly satisfied.	Allowed
